



Donald D. Campbell, MD

December 31, 1925 - February 26, 2013

Don grew up in Omaha, NE, and after graduation from Omaha South High School in 1943 he joined the Navy and was accepted into the V-5 Naval Aviation Cadet Program, where he went on to attend St. Ambrose College, Davenport, IA, Notre Dame University, Southbend, IN, and the University of Colorado, Boulder, CO. Upon graduation from the University of Colorado with a BA degree in psychology, he was commissioned an Ensign in the Navy in 1947. In August 1949 after completing flight training he was awarded his pilot wings and for the next four years until 1953 he flew anti-submarine patrols in the North Atlantic based in Newfoundland and Iceland. Prior to resigning his Navy commission in 1954 to pursue a career in medicine, he was a flight instructor in multi-engine aircraft. After graduation from medical school at the University of Nebraska College of Medicine, Omaha, NE, in 1960 and completing his internship and residency at hospitals in the Seattle-Tacoma area, he went on to practice as an anesthesiologist for 25 years at Good Samaritan Hospital in Portland. He retired in 1987 and in 1995 he and his wife moved to Sunriver. Don loved the game of golf. The fun he had playing it with his family and friends was his greatest joy. Off the links he enjoyed traveling the country with Ann in their motorhome, reading WWII and early American history, collecting Western and Native American art, exploring his life-long interest in photography, and of course cheering on his beloved Nebraska Cornhusker football teams.
