“ In a Seattle Prep publication, I just learned of Dick's death. I extend my sympathy to his family, and it might be appropriate to offer some ancient history. Dick and I were classmates at Prep, and friends as well. He was cheerful and outgoing, but his social activity was limited by his FULL- TIME employment selling tickets at the Greyhound Bus depot. At occasional episodes of illicit suds intake, we would entertain ourselves by asking him for fare quotes to various sites, and I don't remember his ever getting one wrong. His incredible memory was evident at Seattle U. His German teacher, Fr. Flajole, said that he never gave an "A" grade, because an "A" meant "perfect". Dick got the only Flajoie "A." He was the valedictorian for our class of '49, and eight years later, for his class at the UW School of Medicine. I went off to Omaha for med school, and we never had contact after that except location on the annual list of alumni donors to Prep, but I've never forgotten our pleasant association. It was no surprise to see in the obituary the impressive list of his accomplishments. All the family should be proud.
