Vicki Rae (Marshall) Lundmark, age 77, passed away peacefully, surrounded by family in Bend, Oregon July 23rd, 2020.

Vicki was born February 2, 1943 in McMinnville, Oregon to Donald and Ellen Marshall. She was raised in McMinnville, Grants Pass, Seattle, and Dayton. After graduating from Amity High School in 1961, she worked for Oregon Mutual in McMinnville. Later she worked as a Medical Transcriptionist for The Doctors Clinic in Salem, Bend Memorial Clinic, and Dr Zirker in Bend, along with various other medical facilities in Salem and Bend. She raised two children, Clint Lundmark of Portland and Craig Lundmark of Bend.

Over several decades Vicki cherished bringing the entire family together at her home for holiday celebrations, most notably the yearly Christmas gathering. She was an avid supporter of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, the Humane Society of Central Oregon and the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals. She enjoyed bingo, playing cards with her friends, gardening, cooking and seeing her family as much as possible. Vicki's beautiful smile and infectious laugh will be fondly remembered by anyone who knew her.
